



I'm so sorry for the delay in getting back to you. I wanted to check with our Moderator, but then got distracted and forgot, sorry!

I think the amount of time that you have after a town election is 3 days to ask for a recount, so you must keep them that long of course. We usually send

them back after two weeks – for a town election. For the state elections the SOS usually sends an email after 30 days to remind us to return the cards. I don't remember always getting a letter like that, but we stick with 30 days, as the amount of time for recounts is different for state and federal. In the case of the Primary elections, that

is when we usually get the word from the SOS, as there is not much time between the Primary and the General elections.

We use LHS for our paper ballots used in town elections and we bought our machine from them. They are also responsible for maintaining the machines. We send our

memory cards to their office in Salem, NH. I use Priority Mail and send them in a padded envelope, so they have a tracking number.

I hope this answers your questions. If you need more information from me, please let me know.
